IT Compatibility

Application Overview

The current version of 2MuchTalk installs to a single user-designated folder and consists of a standalone executable file that uses relative files in the same installed folder. All settings for the program are contained within this folder. An Access database that is blank upon install is the only file to which the program writes and is used to store user-created data. The application is written in Adobe Flash and is initially intended for single user, standalone PC execution under Microsoft Windows. The Flash program is packaged with the 'Zinc' utility to enable the application to read/write to an Access database in a sub-folder of the program.

The program .exe file plus various support files and an empty Access .mdb file are then wrapped into a single installation file ('Setup.exe' for the free version, 'SetupPlus.exe' for the extended version) and these are in turn zipped respectively into '2MuchTalk.zip' and '2MuchTalkPlus.zip' for downloading. During the installation procedure a 2MuchTalk or 2MuchTalk+ shortcut is placed on the desktop. The user may choose where to install the program and upon completing the installation may open the User Manual .PDF document and/or launch the application.

Application in Use

The program runs at a size of 1024 x 768 pixels and a toggle button on the interface allows it to be locked 'always on top' of other applications, if required. The 'RunMeeting' window may be minimised to a smaller panel which can be moved to enable it to be placed in a corner of another application, such as a Microsoft Powerpoint presentation. The RunMeeting window may also be expanded to fill the entire screen with a dynamic display of the current meeting cost. The application may also be fully minimised onto the MS Windows bottom task bar.

The 2MuchTalk entry in the MS Windows Start menu offers three options: program launch, program uninstall and open User Manual. When the application is uninstalled it leaves behind the Access .mdb file in its folder in case the user wishes later to re-install the original program or install the extended 2MuchTalkPlus version. Provided that the new installation is in the same location as the original program (this is assumed by the installation procedure) then all details of meetings, attendees, etc. will have been preserved.

The Help panel of the program offers:

- open local copy of the User Manual pdf that was installed, requiring the Adobe Acrobat Reader to be present on the system
- launch user's default internet browser and open the 2MuchTalk FAQ page
- launch user's default internet browser and open the 2MuchTalk Tutorials page
- launch user's default internet browser and open the 2MuchTalk Upgrade download page

The user may export data to a .csv file in the 2MuchTalkPlus version of the program. When doing so the user may choose the destination to which they will save the file and will be warned if they attempt to overwrite a file of the same name.

The user can also generate email invitations to meeting attendees and create a 'meeting request' compatible with e-mail clients such as Microsoft Outlook. When doing so, a temporary text file with the extension .ics is created with the meeting data in the user's default temp folder. This file is then launched and handled by the default program associated with .ics files, such as Microsoft Outlook. At this point it is no longer handled by the 2MuchTalk program and can be edited, saved and sent as the user would normally do.
